Introduction

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this.

Provision

Following a self-review and a staff skills audit the following objectives were agreed for the academic year 2013 – 2014:

- Provide speicalist teacher to work alongside our teachers when teaching dance in order to strengthen teaching and learning in this subject across the school.
- Support and engage the least active children in physical activities during lunchtimes.
- Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- Increase pupils' participation in sports competitions and festivals.
- Improve our resources and equipment to support the development of the subject.

The impact of the use of the grant will be reviewed at the end of the first year.
